COLDWALTHAM PARISH Weekly Newsletter 7 for Spring 2020

We are now two months + into a public health crisis which is affecting us all. Current information suggests the "lockdown" will persist for a further unspecified period, although there may be small derestrictions in what the PM says to Parliament on Monday 11th May. There is still much that is very unclear about what happens next.

The numbers of infection cases and deaths do not seem to be declining as quickly as in other countries: I wonder if this is anything to do with how many cars are on the road? We heard this week of rumours about how busy Arundel was with visitors, and we know the pictures of Brighton suggest a lot of people are 'on the move.' The writer, who is the 'founder' of the local Speedwatch group, did some traffic counting on Friday (8th), and found that the traffic level was more than 50% of the normal flow – that doesn't look like 'staying at home" as much as it should – and this will no doubt increase as this week progresses – please stay at home, and maintain your distance! Every journey could endanger someone else. Vehicle speeds are also much, much higher than normal, and the increased number of walkers and cyclists need to take care.

On a limited bases Recycling Sites across West Sussex will open on the 11th May. Only use these if it is really necessary and if your waste presents a risk of injury to harm or health and cannot be put out with your normal regular kerbside collection. Only general waste and household waste will be accepted. Social distancing barriers will be in place. There will be additional guidance on site. Whenever we see "fly-tipping" we will report it, and your rubbish will be traced.

We have been asking for WSCC to fill in pot-holes in the village and at last the big one on the A29 has been done! Only a few left to go - please carry on reporting these!

If there any changes affecting use of the Alban Head Playing Fields we will update you in the next newsletter.

The Labouring Man has an enhanced menu: please do try and support the shop at the Labouring Man via its take-away menu.

Please remember if you are making unnecessary journeys in your car you may be responsible for endangering the public health of us all.

Many local shops are now offering enhanced delivery services: this includes the Fittleworth Community Shop. Details are available on their website, and below.

It would be a shame to be opening up addresses to less innocent participants in terms of burglary or fraud – so please be careful.

From Sandham Hall:

Our Post Office re-opened on Thursday. Our Post Office is in full swing opening Mon, Tue and Thu, 9am to 1pm. You are asked to enter through the Village Hall front door and maintain social distancing if you need to queue. It is most important that we keep to the queueing process and if there appears to be a crowd, maybe come back later.

But where are the Village Hall lights? The fitting of the lights has been delayed again due a problem with supply. Hopefully, they will be in place soon. The electrician will work around the Post Office opening.

Unfortunately, the front door does not have step-free access, so we ask for people's understanding and care if the occasional person needs to access the Post Office counter directly. While waiting feel free to use the Village Hall WiFi (SMVH Guest/Sandhamhall). You will notice electrical wires dangling from the ceiling in the hall. These are all safe and awaiting new light fittings which will be fitted on Friday when the Post Office is closed.


From St.James School(AVF):
