Cllr Nelson welcomed Tom Warder Chief Executive for AirS (Action in Rural Sussex) to the meeting.

Tom Warder spoke to members regarding the work AirS does helping rural communities achieve affordable housing for residents with a connection to that community; assisting communities with housing surveys to determine any housing need in their community, assisting communities to being sites to development, especially rural exception sites (edge of village) etc. These schemes have become more challenging in the current times, so AirS have been moving to Community Led Housing schemes and assisting to determine where the site is and who the homes are for, where the properties are kept in the community in perpetuity.

Tom highlighted four routes, Community Land Trust (CLT), Co-Housing, Co-operatives and Community Self Build.

CLT are community owned & controlled; have an open & democratic structure, permanently affordable homes. CLT can also be for other assets like post offices, where they are on a not-for-profit basis and have long-term stewardship. There is an ongoing momentum in HDC to increase the numbers of CLT. SDNP are a big supporter of CLT and AirS in particular.

The start point would be to carry out a new housing need survey, to determine what housing need there is within the community. Often this highlights residents who are not registered with the local authority, as they might not be a high priority for housing. These Affordable Housing Schemes would put local connection or the resident over any acute need for housing and keeping the properties available to local residents.

26 / 07.00 **CHAIRMAN’S REPORT**

Cllr Nelson updated members:

- He advised that he would be writing to the PC requesting funds from CIL for the Alban Head to purchase rubber mulch for the Children’s Play Area, the intention is to purchase a significant amount to enable the safety surface to be maintained for a few years to come.
- He and Cllr Coughtrey are due to circulate the Priority Statement following the comments received shortly.
- He had received an email from HDC advising that in principle the Brookland Way Play Area can be ours, however, the community is not ready to accept it yet.

26 / 08.00 **ITEMS FROM MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL / PARISH CLERK**

26 / 08.01 Cllr Dennis updated Council regarding recent planning applications.

- Hardham Gate – Repair and stabilisation work to existing chimney stacks.
- Field east of London Road – an application for a dog exercise area. The PC comment noted that when the lease expires, the field should be returned to agricultural land.
- 7 Brookview – for a rear extension, it is the last one in the row to add an extension, as there are roof lights the PC comment will make reference to the dark skies.
- Coldwaltham Farm – changes to the plan outlines.
- Southern Water – Discharge of a planning condition.

26 / 08.02 The Clerk updated Council regarding recent applications decisions:

26 / 08.03 Cllr Dreger updated members regarding the support of Andrew Griffiths MP, for average speed cameras (ASC), highlighting those along A272 between Midhurst and Petworth, and on the A286 around Duncton.

He had completed a survey on average speed cameras, which he would share, and encouraged members to contribute too, Cllr Dreger is keen to that our community is included should any ASC be installed along the A29 and that Bury Parish isn’t the only section of the A29 to benefit.

The short deadline has highlighted again the issue of how we communicate with the community when there is a pressing issue which might need resident participation. Cllr Nelson advised that he had many email addresses for residents, but in the past, they had indicated that they do not wish to constantly be receiving emails for the PC.

26 / 08.04 Cllr Evans noted the new entrance at Hardham. The clerk advised that a planning application had been approved; to install a new entrance for the farm. Their current access is very tight between the cottages in Old London Road.

26 / 08.05 Cllr Evans noted that there are large numbers of containers at the café at Whiteways. He understands that a new café is being built which will be larger and more permanent than the current wooden structure. N.B. Clerk’s note the approved application ref: SDNP/25/02061/FUL.

26 / 08.06 Cllr Davies requested that street name signs could be installed at each end of Old London Road, the stretch by St Botolph’s church, it currently has no street name which is difficult for delivery drivers. The Clerk would contact HDC.
